RESOLUTION 2020-22

A BOISE COUNTY RESOLUTION TO DESTROY CERTAIN RECORDS OF BOISE COUNTY BEING IT TEMPORARY TO BE HELD FOR TWO YEARS; SEMI PERMANENT TO BE HELD FOR FIVE YEARS OR PERMANENT TO BE HELD FOR TEN YEARS OR MORE

WHEREAS, Idaho Code 31-871(2)(d) allows for the destruction of certain records of the county; and,

WHEREAS, such records may only be destroyed by resolution of the board of county commissioners after regular audit (review) and upon the advice of the prosecuting attorney; and,

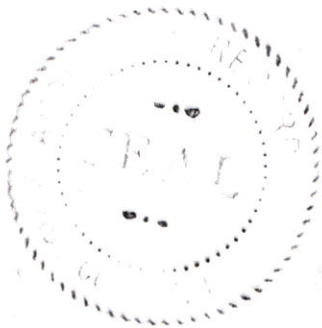
WHEREAS, the resolution ordering destruction must list, in detail, the records to be destroyed; and,

WHEREAS, the disposition shall be under the direction and supervision of the elected official or department head responsible for such records; and,


WHEREAS, certain Boise County departments have reviewed their records retention criteria, as defined in Idaho Code 31-871(1) and the Idaho Association of Counties retention schedule, and have determined that the attached records are eligible for destruction.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT HEREBY RESOLVED that the Boise County Board of Commissioners shall forthwith approve the destruction of the attached listed records.
