## RESOLUTION #2020-30

### **A BOISE COUNTY RESOLUTION TO CONTINUE A DISASTER EMERGENCY DECLARATION**

**WHEREAS**, worldwide detection of the 2019 novel Coronavirus (COVID-19), including in the United States of America, has progressed to a pandemic declared by the World Health Organization on March 11, 2020; and

**WHEREAS**, effective March 1<sup>st</sup>, 2020, Donald Trump, the President of the United States, proclaimed and declared the COVID-19 outbreak in the United States as constituting a national emergency; and

**WHEREAS**, on March 13, 2020, Brad Little, Governor of the State of Idaho, by Proclamation found, proclaimed, and declared, the existence of a state of emergency as a result of the occurrence and imminent threat to public health and safety arising from the effects of COVID-19; and

**WHEREAS**, there continues to be a threat to public health and the lives of the citizens of **BOISE COUNTY**, and

**WHEREAS**, there continues to be a risk to the operation of public infrastructure as a result of the 2019 novel coronavirus (COVID-19) in **BOISE COUNTY**; and

**WHEREAS**, Idaho Code Section 46-1011(1) authorizes the Commissioners of **BOISE COUNTY**, Idaho to continue the declaration of an **EMERGENCY**, and to authorize the furnishing of aid and assistance, thereunder;

**NOW THEREFORE**, be it resolved, and declared by the **BOISE COUNTY**, Idaho Board of Commissioners, as follows:

1. The emergency declared on March 17, 2020, continues to exist within **BOISE COUNTY**, created by the threat of novel coronavirus (COVID-19) to **BOISE COUNTY** residents, creating a risk to life and the continued operation of public infrastructure.
2. These conditions require the activation of the response and recovery aspects of applicable disaster emergency plans.
3. Such continued emergency may require State emergency assistance to supplement local efforts in providing a coordinated multi-agency effort to mitigate, avert and lessen the impact of the spread of the novel coronavirus (COVID-19).

4. Such emergency may require State emergency assistance to supplement local efforts for any impacts to life and the continued operation of public infrastructure.
5. This emergency declaration will be in effect until June 18<sup>th</sup>, 2020, unless modified, extended or terminated.

Adopted in open session this 5<sup>th</sup>, day of May 2020, by those Commissioners subscribing their names hereto.


