

RESOLUTION

A RESOLUTION ESTABLISHING A SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR SUBDIVIDERS IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 36 OF THE BOISE COUNTY SUBDIVISION ORDINANCE 78-2 [REDACTED]; and

WHEREAS, the purpose of said fees and schedule is to place the cost of subdivision platting on the developer vs. the County and taxpyers of this County.

NOW THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE BOARD OF COUNTY COMMISSIONERS THAT THE BELOW LISTED SCHEDULE OF FEES FOR SUBDIVIDERS BE IMPOSED AND ADOPTED IN ACCORDANCE WITH SECTION 36 of the Subdivision Ordinance as amended: - *condominiums \$50.00*

1. Preliminary Applications: \$200.00 plus \$1.00 per acre for the total area included in the Preliminary Application.
2. Final Application: \$200.00 plus \$1.00 per lot for each lot or living unit included in the Final Application.
3. Street and Road Plans Review and Site Inspection: \$50.00 plus \$0.10 per centerline foot
4. Final Application fees for land developments other than for living units shall be on equivalency basis as compared to residential development fees, with amount of fees to be determined and set by the County Engineer for each application submitted, subject to appeal and review by the Board of County Commissioners.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the fees hereinabove described are to be paid in addition to any other fees such as the checking and investigation of a plat or construction drawing. In the event the County shall be required to check such plats, and/or construction drawings for conformance to the standards contained in the subdivision ordinance, and/or for accuracy, the cost for such work shall be a charge upon the subdivider in addition to the fees provided above.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that the schedule of fees hereinabove provided shall be effective upon passage of this resolution.
